The National Association of Broadcasters started the VOICE OF DEMOCRACY scholarship competition in 1947. The Veterans of Foreign Wars became a sponsor in the late 1950s and assumed sole responsibility for the program in 1961.

Post 2073 is participating in an annual essay/speech scholarship VOICE OF DEMOCRACY contest for high school students. The contest starts at the local (or Post) -level, with winners advancing through District-level [the Sacramento County area], then through the Department-level [the entire State of California] and finally on to the National-level. The winners at each level will receive a cash award. The winner from Post 2073 will receive a cash award of Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00), with the Second Place winner receiving a cash award of Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) and the Third Place winner receiving a cash award of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00). At the District-level the winner will receive a cash award, amount not yet disclosed. At the Department-level the winner will receive a cash award of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00). The winner at the National-level will receive a Thirty-five Thousand Dollar (\$35,000.00) scholarship.

The high school student participating in the contest will be required to write an essay, and to deliver that essay in a three - five minute speech. The contestants are to write the essay themselves, without help from teachers, parents, friends, or Artificial Intelligence. The subject selected by the National Office of the Veterans of Foreign Wars is: ***WHAT A VETERAN TAUGHT ME ABOUT AMERICA***. The contestant will be judged on originality, delivery and content.

The rules of the contest are set out on the back of the *Official Entry Form*. The properly completed *Official Entry Form* together with the student's essay, of which the student is its sole author, and together with a flash drive of a voice recording of the student delivering that essay in the student's own voice, must be delivered to Post 2073 no later than 31 October 2026. The essay and the recorded delivery will be judged by a panel selected by Post 2073 from the Elk Grove community. The winner will be announced by and on 15 November 2026. The winning students being given their cash awards at a Post 2073 Dinner on 10 December 2026 where the winners will voice-deliver their winning essays.

What is the Voice of Democracy Program?

Since 1947, the Voice of Democracy has been the Veterans of Foreign Wars' (VFW's) premier scholarship program. Each year, nearly 26,000 high school students compete for more than \$2 million in scholarships and incentives. Prizes and scholarships can be awarded at the Post, District, state and national level. National winners will be notified of their scholarship & placement. Students compete by writing and recording an audio essay on an annual patriotic theme. This year's theme is,

"What a Veteran Taught Me About America"

The Rules

The Voice of Democracy is open to students in grades 9-12 by the Oct. 31 deadline who are enrolled in a public, private or parochial high school or home study program in the United States, its territories and possessions; or dependents of U.S. military or civilian personnel in overseas schools. Although U.S. citizenship is not required, students must be lawful U.S. permanent residents or have applied for permanent residence (the application for which has not been denied) and intend to become a U.S. citizen at the earliest opportunity allowed by law. Foreign exchange students, students age 20 or over, GED or Adult Education Students are ineligible.

You must be the sole author of your essay. Inappropriate use of ChatGPT or other AI tools is not allowed. The recording must be in your own voice and in English. Hearing/speech impaired students should email the Voice of Democracy National Office at youthscholarships@vfw.org for special instructions. No music, singing, poetry or sound effects are allowed. To ensure fairness and impartiality in judging, essays **must be anonymous**. **Please do not include your name, address, school name, or any other personal identifiers in the body of your essay.** Additionally, avoid references to your race, sex, religion, national origin, or other specific personal characteristics that could reveal your identity. General references to nationality or patriotic identity (such as being an American or referencing American values) are permitted if they are relevant to the essay theme. However, personal identifiers tied to your individual background or experience should be avoided.

You may enter only one competition at one Post (if otherwise eligible) per year. At any time during the contest, additional participant personal information could be requested by the VFW, including but not limited to a photograph, SSN, or biographical information.

Advancement

Decisions of Judges at all levels are final. One winner for every 15 entries from each Post advances to District and one District winner advances to the state (Department) competition. Contact the post where you entered at to check on your advancement

What Is the Deadline for My Entry?

All entries competing at the Post level must be in the hands of that VFW Post by midnight, Oct. 31, 2026. It is the responsibility of the student to meet this deadline by submitting their entry to the proper location - ensuring it is a participating Post.

How do I enter?

Record your original 3-5 minute (+ or - 5 second max.) audio in MP3 format (no videos) on a flash drive, or other electronic device. You will submit the recording, a typed essay and this completed entry form. Provide these items to your school/group competition or VFW Post for judging.

All entries begin at the VFW Post level. The only exception is where schools/classes/youth groups have large numbers of students and wish to conduct their own competition. Submitting one winner for each 15 students to the VFW Post. Individual students may submit their entry directly to a Post. Your local post will give instructions on how to turn in your entry to them. Audio may be submitted physically on a Flash Drive, emailed to the Post (with permission) or submitted through our online platform using Scholars App. **To submit through Scholars App you must first receive a QR code or link from your local post.** Entries sent to VFW National Headquarters directly will not be considered.

What Are the Judging Criteria?

Originality is worth 35 points:

Treatment of the theme should show imagination and human interest.

Delivery is worth 35 points:

Speak in a clear and credible manner.

Content is worth 30 points:

Clearly express your ideas in an organized manner. Fully develop your theme and use transitions to move smoothly from one idea to another.
